Packing List

Dress on board is casual, comfortable and practical clothing. Lightweight clothing that can be layered is the key to warmth & comfort. ***** Please pack wisely as space is limited aboard the vessel *****

Clothes to bring:

Quick dry fabrics/clothes are excellent and preferred –

Please Note - We do not have a washer/dryer available for use onboard.

- Casual pants and shorts - jeans, khakis, sweat pants
- Long and short sleeve shirts for layering
- Sweatshirt, sweater, or fleece for warmth
- Swimsuit – Should one want to take the Alaska glacier cold water plunge
- Waterproof jacket/rain gear including pants for those rainy times
- Light-weight hiking boots or hiking shoes
- Light foot wear for kayaking
- Rubber Boots for beach access to/from Dingy (If you desire not to use the one provided by NPE)
- Hat, gloves, knit cap, and warm socks

NOTE: Cotton shirts and undershirts are great for sightseeing, relaxing and dining on aboard; but do not work well for hikes and beach combing. Polypropylene, wool and other such cold weather articles of clothing are better to keep you warm and dry.

Things to bring:

- Travel documents – passport (if applicable), confirmation of reservation, credit/debit card, medical and/or travel insurance policy/information
- Duffel Bag - Collapsible soft sided (please, no hard suitcases – storage is very limited)
- Sunscreen (non-oil based)
- Sunglasses
- Earplugs – Even though we are a quiet boat (no generators at night) there are still natural noises aboard
- Seasickness medication - If you are predisposed to motion sickness
- Water bottle – All tap water aboard is potable water; we will also provide a filtered water dispenser
- Camera
- Backpack – Used during beach combing and hiking
- Binoculars (we do provide some binoculars on board for your use)
- Insect repellent
- Lip protection and hand lotion
- Reading material
